Dear Ohioans,

When two people are together in a state of serious peril, is either person justified in killing the other to survive? More importantly, what if one person holds a charge of care over the other?

“Thou shalt not kill,” still applies, and most emphatically if one person is a caregiver to the other. The other is not only innocent, but twice vulnerable: first, to the peril; second, to the mercy of the caregiver.

Justifying the caregiver killing the other person is particularly *heinous* due to the trust and honor afforded to the caregiver by God and society in expectation of life-saving, not life-ending, measures. The caregiver may not claim one’s own survival as a justifiable reason to kill the other. The worse the peril, the greater the expectation for protecting the other.

The “prolife” movement in America has justified pregnant mothers killing their own unborn children if the mother’s life is in danger. This heinous exception to murder is the foot in the door for all other exceptions to murder. Even our Supreme Court identified this prolife hypocrisy in *Roe*, saying, *“...if the fetus is a person who is not to be deprived of life [by Fourteenth Amendment protection]... does not the... exception [of the mother’s condition] appear to be out of line with the Amendment’s command?”* Such hypocrisy seems to have been the opportunity for the Supreme Court to deal lawlessly in *Roe* in not justly recognizing the personhood of our unborn children. In turn, we ignored this lawlessness for 50 years in pursuit of the same heinous exceptions to murder, ourselves justifying our unjust court. Our allowing our unjust court to judge itself in overturning *Roe* has *not* resolved this. We are all abominable before the LORD.

“He that justifieth the wicked, and he that condemneth the just, even they both are abomination to the LORD.” (Proverbs 17:15)

We must repent of *all* of our exceptions to murder *now*. Please repent with me. Plead with our public servants to repent.

Unborn child murder, “abortion,” must be abolished, immediately and totally, in all our jurisdictions of the U.S.
